





Curriculum Expectations

We plan our learning and topics around children's own personal interests.

In Communication and Language, we are going to listen carefully to directions given to us by classroom adults and show our understanding by demonstrating what we have been asked. We are going to talk about ourselves and past experiences. This term we are going to try and listen attentively and remain focus for 5 minutes.

In Personal Social & Emotional

Development, we will begin to learn and become familiar with the school rules and values. Throughout this term we are going to be supported and encouraged to begin to develop friendships within our class.

We will also be encouraged to go to the toilet independently and regularly wash our hands after all activities. When learning outside we will be encouraged to put our coat on ourselves and pull our zipper up with little support.

In Physical development we will be developing both our fine and gross motor skills. In fine motor, we will begin to practise using one handed tools such as scissors as well as being encouraged to develop our pencil grip, holding the pencil between our thumb and two fingers ('crocodile grip').

In gross motor we will be encouraged to negotiate space in large and small areas both indoors and outdoors. This will be developed throughout many activities such as our PE lessons as well as the use of our school bikes and scooters. In Literacy we will be exposed to many different books. We will be encouraged to join in with repeated phrases and rhymes and well as retell stories in our own words. We will be introduced to our phonic scheme Read Write Inc. (RWI) and begin to recognise, say and write our single letter sounds.

When creating marks or recording letters we will be encourage to talk about our work.

We will also be encouraged to copy and write our names on a daily basis, with support if needed.

Foxes and Squirrels sees-sees

roxes' learning is developed around their personal interests and ideas. We develop the key skills around these ideas to ensure their learning is fun and engaging all of the time.

In Mathematics we will begin our journey of Maths Mastery following the White Rose Scheme. This term we will be encourage to explore maths and the apparatus available within our learning environment. Once we have become familiar with the various resources we will begin to explore different ways to match and sort, make comparisons, as well as identifying and creating our own patterns.

In Understanding of the World we will be encouraged to talk about our own family and personal experiences. We will also be encouraged to explore the similarities and difference between ourselves and those around us, recognising that everyone is different and unique.

Throughout our learning we will have the opportunity to develop our computing skills by having daily access to the interactive whiteboard and classroom desktops. In Expressive Arts & Design we will be exploring different musical instruments, listening to the sounds that they make as well as sing along to familiar and unfamiliar songs.

This term we will also have the opportunity to explore colour, investigating how to make new colours by mixing others together. Through various construction resources, we will have the opportunity to build and create our ideas to develop our imaginations.
