Literacy

This week our writing will be related to our trip to the Library. Children will be learning to use time words (first, next then, after that, finally etc) to write a recount of an event. We will be completing assessments on comprehension, spelling and grammar to inform planning for next half term.

Maths

We have now reached the end of book 1 in the Maths No Problem programme so children will spend the week working on assessment tasks to consolidate learning and to support planning for next half term.

Topic

Across all topic subjects, children will be assessed on their learning this half term. They will be making books about Florence Nightingale to showcase their learning!

In Music, we will continue to work on using tuned instruments (ocarina and glockenspiel) to play rhythms along to the song 'In the Groove'. We will be performing this in our assembly on Friday!

P.E

On a Monday, children will have PE with Rising Stars sports coach and will be developing their skills in Games. On a Friday, we will be working on Gymnastics and we will continue to work on exploring ways of travelling and performing basic gymnastic actions over mats. Children will develop their awareness of shapes they can make with their body.
