Week beginning: 24.9.18

Literacy

This week the children will be working learning all about Harvest. They will learn about the how the celebration began long ago and how different traditions came about through the years. Children will then move onto how Harvest is celebrated around the world. They will investigate in pairs how different cultures celebrate it and create fact files.

The children will be getting their new spellings on Monday to learn at home and will be tested on Friday.

Maths

This week children will be learning to practice addition in different ways. They will investigate using a tens frame to help them to visualise numbers in tens and units and then move onto looking at the relationships between single digit numbers and 2 digit numbers e.g. if $5 + 4 = 9$ then $50 + 40 = 90$.

The children will end the week learning how to add using the column addition method.

Method 3 Use  to add.



Step 1 Add the ones.
