Week beginning: 15.10.18


Literacy

This week it is assessment week. Children will be tested on their spellings of some of the year 2 common words as well as the year 1 high frequency words. They will also complete some independent writing tasks based on the work we have been doing on Traditional tales. This week we will be recreating their own version of Jack and the Beanstalk, changing the characters. Children will also be learning how to use commas in a sentence.

The children will be getting their new spellings on Monday to learn at home and will be tested on Friday.

Maths

This week children will be tested on the areas of Maths we have been learning so far this half term. Children will also be learning about multiplication and how to group objects to show how multiplication works.

Topic

In Computing this week children will be learning about what emails are and how they are used safely for communication. They will have a go at creating their own emails (they will not be sending any) to send to traditional tale characters.

P.E

In P.E this week children will continue their work on using apparatus to help them learn more about how they use their bodies to travel in different ways and how they can use different body parts to balance.

Information

Children will be tested on their spellings and times tables every Friday. Please make sure you are supporting your children with learning these at home. 😊
