Literacy

This week the children will be recapping on using the correct punctuation in sentences so that they are ready for year 3. Children will also recap on suffix words and will complete a task where they can make them by putting them together like a jigsaw puzzle. The children will also complete some reading comprehension assessment tasks.

Maths

This week in Maths children will be recapping on temperature, reading measurements accurately in degrees Celsius. The children will also look at word problems around temperature. Then the children will practice times tables and using the greater than symbols to compare numbers.
