Week beginning: 24.6.19

Literacy

This week the children will be writing a recount about our trip to Windsor Castle. They will use time words, connectives, words with suffixes and subordination to write their recount. They will also be writing a diary entry about the day in the life of a knight, using lots of adjectives and exciting vocabulary.



Maths

This week in Maths children will be recapping on things they have been learning throughout the year. We will be working on identifying and naming 3D shapes and sorting them into groups according to a specific criteria. Children will also complete their work on position, direction and movement, using the correct mathematical vocabulary.

Topic

In R.E this week we will be listening to Buddhist stories with morals and identifying what those morals are and what they mean. In Geography children will be using maps and atlases to plan the best UK locations for building a castle.

P.E

In P.E this week we will be working on the skill of kicking using beanbags. Children will practice moving fluently, changing direction and speed easily and avoiding collisions.

On Tuesday we will be going on our trip to Windsor Castle. Please make sure children are wearing their full school uniform and comfortable school shoes as there will be a lot of walking.

Homework
