Literacy

This week the children will be recapping on using apostrophes for possession. The children will complete some tasks where their understanding will be assessed. The children will also be working on non-fiction writing this week where they will use what they have learnt about our topic to create an information booklet using the correct features.

Maths

This week in Maths children will be recapping on the properties of 2D and 3D shapes, naming them correctly and describing them using the correct vocabulary. The children will also look at the 2D shapes on the faces of 3D shapes and make links.

Topic

In Science this week the children will observe their broad bean seed that they are each growing and make a diary entry describing what they see. They will use this information to decide if their seed are still in the most appropriate conditions to help it grow well. In Geography this week the children will be creating their own map with a simple key for some of the land features.
