

THORNHILL PRIMARY SCHOOL UNIFORM

We like all our children to wear school uniform. It gives children a sense of belonging and makes them proud of their school. You can buy our uniform from BEST LOOK, High Street North, Dunstable, 01582 603 603. Our uniform is as follows:

UNIFORM

- Purple sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo
- Grey trousers or skirt (pinafore if preferred)
- White polo shirt (school logo) for Years R - 4
- In summer the girls can wear a purple and white checked dress:
- Book bag: this is compulsory for all children from Years R – 4. Pupils in Years 5 and 6 may bring in a small suitable school bag that fits into our lockers. Large bags will not be permitted as space is restricted.
- White Shirt and tie (Years 5 and 6 only)

PE Uniform is as follows:

- Black shorts (can be purchased anywhere) **No Leggings to be worn**
- White crew neck t-shirt
- Plimsolls
- Trainers can be worn for outdoor PE.
- All children will require a PE kit kept in a named draw-string bag
- Children may wear a black or grey tracksuit during the colder months of the year (**NO hoodies are to be worn**)
- Branded sportswear should not be worn e.g. club football kits, commercial advertising clothing.

FOOTWEAR

- Children should wear black school shoes footwear to complement the school uniform. All children require sensible black shoes for school so that they can run around and play during break times.
- **Children are not allowed to wear heeled shoes, trainers, boots or open toed sandals.**

Please make sure that all items of clothing are clearly marked with your child's name.

JEWELLERY / MAKE UP / NAIL POLISH

Children are not allowed to wear jewellery of any description (except for ear studs). All earrings must be removed for PE. Many serious accidents happen during P.E. or playtime as a result of children wearing jewellery, especially earrings. Children are not permitted to have any other body piercings.

Watches may be worn, but the school cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage.

Nail polish and make up is not allowed.

HAIR

For health and safety reasons any child with hair longer than shoulder length must have it tied back. Bobbles, hair bands, bows, scrunchies etc must be small and plain.

Hairstyles for school should be sensible with no shaved in designs or dyes (temporary or permanent).
